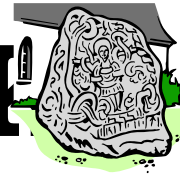
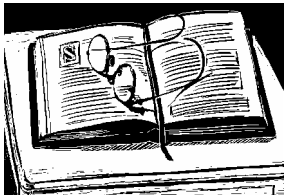
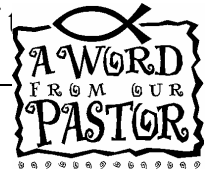

My Presbyterian Planning calendar indicates that Sunday May 20th is designated, "Heritage Sunday." Amidst all the energy and attention currently focused on this congregation's future, I believe it's appropriate that we take this occasion to appreciate the rich history of Rockledge Presbyterian Church. I was recently reminded of RPC "goodly heritage" Psalm 16:6 when member Bob Roth shared with me a letter former pastor Charles Sellers wrote to the congregation, announcing the first official gathering in our present sanctuary back in April 1957. The following excerpt seems worthy of our remembrance and reflection:

Now after many months—it is no exaggeration to say quite a few years—we will enter our place of worship. We trust no one will ever enter this place except with the feeling that here, in truth, is "holy ground." We trust none will ever enter here except to give himself or herself anew to God through Christ Jesus our Lord and Savior. We trust that here the faith of each of us will be confirmed in wisdom and in truth by the power of the Holy Spirit alive in us through Christ.

Whenever we enter the church, I hope we will consider how to honor Rev. Seller's trust that this place would truly be "holy ground." Why not...

Savor, as you come and go, the gorgeous river view we are privileged to enjoy at this prized location?

Enjoy quiet moments in the sanctuary before the beginning of worship?

Celebrate the joyful sounds of children coming from our Preschool classrooms?

Respect "God's house" by doing *your* part to keep our building and grounds (especially the kitchen!) clean and attractive?

Relate to those you meet, whether at meetings, in the hallways, or during fellowship events as though you were encountering Jesus himself.

Imagine what a difference *that* would make in our welcoming of newcomers, our decision making, and our inevitable and not necessarily unhealthy disagreements and conflicts!

In all our comings and goings may this be our heartfelt prayer: *I keep the LORD always before me; because he is at my right hand, I shall not be moved.*" Psalm 16:8

Recently I discovered <http://www.peace.org/>, a resource for peace and co-existence. They intend to create a resource for people interested in contemplating, participating in, and contributing to sustainable peace and coexistence. Their comments are worth hearing and giving thought to. It is the obligation of thinking people on this planet to weigh the implications of a future without co-existence, to ponder the underlying causes of today's conflicts, to encourage efforts aimed at addressing these complexities and to promote similar thoughtful consideration by others. Humanity arrives together at the beginning of this new millennium in an age where the knowledge of weapons of mass destruction is but a click away. And we live in a world where terrorism is viewed by some as a legitimate response to the perceived economic and cultural assaults they face. Everyone – every woman, every man, all people of all faiths and all races- must find a way to embrace each others differences and search for compromise and a way to co-exist. The alternative is an unthinkable future for our children- with problems too complex and entwined, what can be done? The solution depends on us all, and it starts with us. Peace Notes of the Presbyterian Peacemaking Program gives us some hope for peace as the General Assemble Council programs entered a new structure on January 1, 2007. A new Peace and Justice Ministry that includes the Presbyterian Peacemaking Program and Presbyterian United Nations Office was created. “Our God is a God who does new things”, notes Director Sara Lisherness. “We look forward to the ways God will use the partnerships created in the new configuration to do ministry in the name of Jesus Christ throughout the Presbyterian Church (USA)”.

Let us be the instruments of Gods Peace as we hold vision of peace, harmony and love for the world and its people.

Unsafe Beach Parks, Code Enforcement, Drugs and Crime, Traffic Lights and Children's Health Care

What could all these things possibly have in common? They are all quality of life issues that an organization called Congregations for Community Action has worked on and made some positive changes around.

CCA is a faith-based organization here in Brevard County that empowers churches and church members to have a positive impact on their neighbors' quality of life. CCA leaders from 9 area churches have been working on a variety of issues in the past four years.

Some Accomplishments

- Improved beach park safety at **Canova Beach Park** by working with Police, Sheriff and Parks and Recreation.
- Worked with the Traffic dept. to increase the light change time delay so senior residents can get all the way across US 1 at one time.
- Worked with **Palm Bay Public Works** department to redesign the Liberia Street Improvement & Drainage Project to meet the needs and safety concerns of the neighborhood.
- Worked with Melbourne and Palm Bay Police Departments to bring the DEA into the area to reduce drugs and crime in the Powell Subdivision (this neighborhood is in both cities). This has brought about a significant drop in the crime rate in the neighborhood.

We have recently begun to look at **health care** issues in our community and what affect, if any we can have on those issues facing many of our families. We have spoken to parents, grandparents and even children about their concerns and what can be done. About 2 years ago the National network that we are affiliated with, PICO (People Improving Communities through Organizing) began to look specifically at Children's Health Care, particularly the SCHIP Program (State Children's Health Insurance Program). This program has allowed a lot of children to live healthier lives because their parents haven't had to choose between health care and groceries. SCHIP is up for reauthorization this year and it is crucial that it continues and is increased, because we all know that health care costs are rising. Despite recent progress in covering more children, there are still more than **9 million uninsured children in our country, 700,000 in our own state and 12,000 in Brevard County.**

On March 7, five CCA leaders traveled to Washington DC to attend the Faith and Families Summit for Children's Health. Over 400 leaders from PICO organizations all over the country came together to ask Congress to push for the \$60 Billion reauthorization of the SCHIP program. We met with members of Congress and their staff to help them understand what is at stake for our children and to ask for their support in the refunding. The Senate approved \$50 Billion last week and now it is in the House. We will continue to monitor the progress and keep working on the refunding, gathering more stories and letting our state and federal leaders hear the pain and ask them to do the "right thing for our most precious gift, our children. Pastor George referred me to Isaiah 65:20 "No more shall there be in it an infant that lives but a few days, or an old man who does not fill out his days, for the child shall die a hundred years old". That's what we are working towards.

If this issue affects you or your family or you are interested in learning more, you can speak to me and/or go to a special PICO website www.coverallchildren.org to learn more and see what **you** can do. Your voice can be heard if you put your faith into action. You can also call your members of Congress, Rep. Dave Weldon and Senators Mel Martinez and Bill Nelson at **(202)224-3121**. Ask them to support full federal funding for the Children's Health Insurance Program to help states **Cover All Children by 2012**.

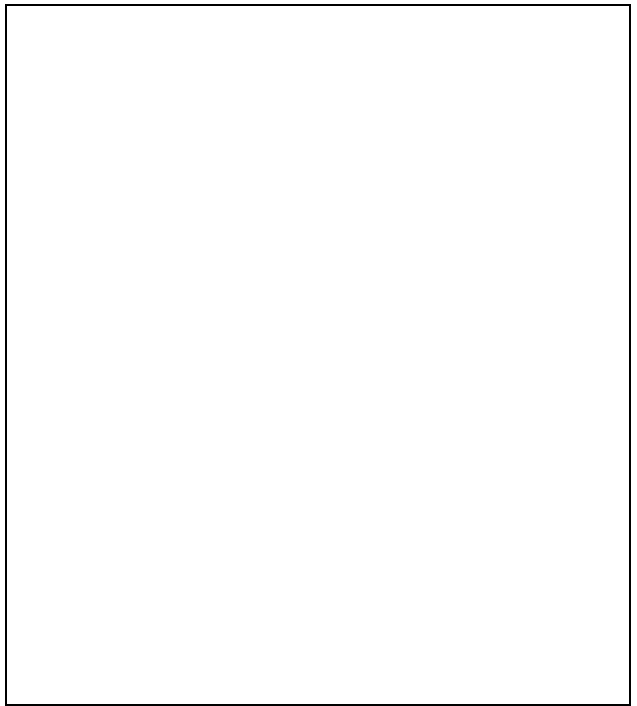
